Administrative Regulation

Minimum School Day, Guidelines for

The length of the regular school day is adopted by the Board. The minimum school day, for which a day of apportioned attendance may be recorded, is prescribed by specific provisions of the Education Code. The following guidelines shall describe the length of required instructional time for a minimum school day and the conditions by which a minimum school day may be called:

A. The following minimum school day requirements are prescribed for regular and special education classes by the Education Code:

Kindergarten	200 minutes, including recesses
Grades 1-3	230 minutes
Grades 4-8	240 minutes
Grades 9-12	240 minutes
Continuation High School	180 minutes

The kindergarten minimum day includes recesses but excludes the noon intermission. The minimum day for grades 1-12 excludes recesses and noon intermission. This constitutes the number of minutes of instructional time only.

Staggered or divided day schedules at the K-6 level must adhere to existing Education Code requirements.

- B. The authority to designate a minimum school day is delegated to the superintendent under procedures specified below:
 - 1. An emergency situation-disaster or disruption of utility service to the school.
 - Declaration of a district-wide or level (i.e. elementary, intermediate, or secondary) minimum instructional day for a specific and well-defined purpose.
 - 3. A project or proposal accepted by the principal and appropriate administrator for secondary or elementary education and approved by the superintendent in accordance with the following priorities:
 - (a) Teacher in-service for state-mandated programs
 - (b) Teacher in-service for district-mandated programs
 - (c) Projects related to school instructional programs
 - (d) Projects related to district and/or school goals/objectives

Special Note:

Planning Procedures

- 1. Approval by the appropriate administrator for secondary or elementary education (to be forwarded to the superintendent for approval) is required at least 15 school days before the project is begun.
- 2. Determination of time, places, goals/objectives, bus schedules, communications, evaluation, and follow-up is a required part of the project planning.
- 3. Schools will return to the regular day schedule upon completion of the project, and the appropriate administrator for secondary or elementary education will so verify.
