BOARD POLICY

Alternative Instruction/Training Position Statement

The Board of Education recognizes that students can benefit from and should be afforded the opportunity for alternative instruction and/or training as approved and established at various programs both within and outside the district.

Therefore, courses in Adult Education, Adult Education Independent Learning, Continuation Education, Career Technical Education, School Age Parenting Education, Vocation and Work Experience, as well as classes in post secondary institutions, shall be open to qualified high school students of the district, as prescribed by administrative regulation.

Additionally, the Board of Education authorizes Independent Study through the Virtual Learning Academy as an optional alternative by which students in grades K-12, who have an inability to attend in-person instruction, may reach curriculum objectives and fulfill graduation requirements.
