Administrative Regulation

Transfer of Credits for Graduation - Day High Schools

Students who transfer from another district may be granted diplomas from the Garden Grove Unified School District day high schools if they have:

- A. Completed a written request to receive a diploma from the district day high school which has recorded the greatest number of credits earned within the district
- B. Successfully completed the prescribed graduation requirements. Credits earned from an accredited agency offering high school level instruction, such as USAFI, are acceptable.

Students who have been in residence at a district day high school for a minimum of one semester in their senior year but have moved outside the district and who have completed all of the Garden Grove Unified School District graduation requirements at a high school in another district may, upon request, be considered eligible to receive a diploma from the last Garden Grove high school attended.

Students who have been designated as non-graduates from a district day high school to enroll at a community college may request to have their diplomas granted from the district day high school of attendance. Such request will be evaluated in accordance with the following criteria:

- A. Three or more college credits in the same class shall equal 10 high school credits or, two units of college credits shall equal five high school credits. No high school credits shall be earned for a one unit college class.
- B. All units to be transferred to the day high school toward the granting of a diploma shall be in subject areas which fulfill the district graduation requirements.
- C. Units to be transferred to the day high school for application toward a diploma may be accepted only if such credit(s) has been "disallowed by the authorities of the college as credit toward graduation from college."

Home teaching students who meet all prescribed graduation requirements may be granted diplomas from the district high school of attendance.

The physical education requirement shall be automatically waived for students receiving home teaching. The 220 credits required for graduation shall be reduced by five credits for each semester the student remains on home teaching status to a maximum of 20 credits.
